



The meeting adjourned at 8:32 pm.






Seahorse Run schooling Show on July 11, 2021






Seahorse Run schooling show July 27, 2021

EFFECTIVE DECEMBER 1, 2021

- 1.2 Coats and Jackets. A short riding jacket or cutaway coat (modified tailcoat) with short tails is permitted at any level of competition. A tailcoat is permitted in all classes above Fourth level. Any single color jacket or tailcoat is permitted and may have subtle pin striping, checks or tweeds. Striped or multi-colored jackets or coats are not permitted. Tasteful and discreet accents, such as a collar of a different hue, modest piping, or crystal decorations, are acceptable. Riders competing in Level 1 dressage competitions or in Opportunity classes are not required to wear a riding jacket or coat.
- 1.3 Vests. Vests of any type are permitted but not required. Vests, including cooling vests, may be worn underneath a riding jacket or when jackets are waived.
 - 1.3.1. Per GR801, a body protecting or inflatable vest, specifically designed for use in equestrian sport, may be worn in any division or class without penalty from the judge.
 - 1.3.2. When the only warm-up available is open to all horses and riders, riders with safety concerns are encouraged to wear an orange vest.
- 1.4 Breeches and Jodhpurs. White, light, or dark colored breeches or jodhpurs are permitted in competition. Bright colors or patterns are not permitted. Contrast piping is allowed.
- 1.5 Shirts and Neckwear. Shirts with tie, choker, stock tie, or integrated stand-up collar are required. Ties, chokers, or stock ties may be any color. If jackets or coats are not worn per DR120.1.2 and DR120.2.1, shirts must be without bold pattern.

VADA MINUTES – July 25, 2021, via Zoom

The meeting was called to order at 8:05 with representatives of all chapters except ShenVADA & Central.

Participating: Angela Stanaway (North East); Sheli King (VN); Sherri Booye (Charlottesville); Sandy Toby (Southeast); Bettina Longaker (Charlottesville); Anna Fox (Fredericksburg); Anne Draine and Lisa Beckwith (North East); Joanne Collins (Fredericksburg); Laura Nelson (Southwest); Eleszabeth McNeel (Charlottesville); Jessie Ginsburg (VN) and members Nancy Doody, Dianne Boyd & Rachel Rice

Anne Draine made a motion to accept the June minutes, which was seconded by Sherri Booye and unanimously approved.

Treasurer's Report – Jessie reported that we had a combined balance of approximately \$153,851, with some funds still remaining in our PP account. No financial review of DAL has yet been completed. The balance reflects a deposit to the facility for the annual banquet, as well as a deposit to the Meadows for the Chapter Challenge but no other expenses or deposits for these activities.

2021 Williams/Warren Symposium Wrap up: Sheli reported that this event was a huge success based upon the evaluations received from the riders and the auditors, both of whom represented a good number of our chapters. The financial report for the event was included in the email with the meeting agenda, and as expected reflected a loss of almost \$6,000. However, events of this type are necessary to support our 501(c)(3) status and are an essential part of our GMO's mission. Dianne Boyd did a great job in locating a professional videographer and the videos of the entire event, including the unmounted sessions, can now be accessed by all our members via the following link https://www.youtube.com/channel/UC8Gms2InTN9qbJB4W4TBmqw/. Chapters are encouraged to share this link. Articles about the event are being written and will be posted on the website and nominated for the USDF for the GMO Newsletter Awards. We have been notified by both the USDF & The Dressage Foundation that all our paperwork was satisfactory and all grant funds would be dispersed.

DAL, July 14-16, semi-wrap up: This was a big, hot and very successful show, with a total of 819 competitors and a full day of breed classes. It was the largest show to date since the show has been run by VADA and all of the Challenge Classes and most of the SHAC Divisions were extremely competitive. We had almost 60 volunteers who contributed almost 800 hours of their time and without them, the show would not have been the success that it was. The weather, while hot, was mostly cooperative, except for Saturday evening when we had to move the evening class and competitor's party inside due to storms. We received very positive feedback on the outside awards area (including ice cream, lemonade and homemade cookies!) and the nearby photo ops area – all the brain child of Nancy Doody. We reinstituted some awards ceremonies this year and will look to increase the number next year as competitors seem to want them. More wrap-up, including a financial report, will follow.

Chapter Challenge – August 21 @ The Meadow, Doswell – entries are now open and the show closes August 11th so chapters should encourage their members to enter. The PL, entry form and rules can be found at https://virginiadressage.org/chapter-challenge. Nancy Doody and Robin Dannels are putting together a program, Sandy has 2 flower/greenery sponsors and is going to have a generic (no-year) banner made that can be used each year. Chapters need to get the special awards to Sandy asap and a check to Jessie for their sponsorship of the MFS challenge. Jessie suggested next year that we just award set amounts for the MFS Challenge and do not tie to the number of freestyle entries received. All agreed that this was a good idea. If anyone is interested in volunteering to get VADA hours, help is needed with set up on Friday. ENTRIES ARE NEEDED TO MAKE THIS SHOW THE SUCCESS WE ALL WANT IT TO BE, SO PLEASE SPREAD THE WORD!

Capital Expenditure: Tina discussed our capital expenditure needs for 2021 - 10 new radios (Beth Rippel is investigating options), 1 new Prestige Dressage Arena and 1 new set of Dressage Letters. Anne moved, Sherri seconded and the Board approved an expenditure of \$5,000 for the ring and letters. We donated our old block ring to the VHC and will ask them for a letter acknowledging the donation for our records. Anne also moved, Sherri seconded and the Board approved the purchase of 10 new radios.

2021 GAIGs: Because the GAIGs are a level 4 show, we decided it was appropriate going forward to hire a co-manager for the show to provide additional support and assistance to the existing management team. Kathy Grisolia has been hired for 2021 show.

2022 VADA Yearly Awards – Nancy Doody has agreed to chair the committee and Tina, Jessie, Anne, Angela and Sheli will serve on the committee.

Chapter Updates:

Fredericksburg – Their 2 licensed shows at Rose Mount on September 11 & 12 are now open and their bit fitting clinic with Kim Gentry was postponed and is now being held on Sept 25/26.

Charlottesville – They still have room for auditors in their clinic with Jim Koford Aug 7 & 8; info on their website.

NEVADA – Schooling shows are scheduled for August 12 & Sept 2nd at Edgehill (evening shows, which have been very popular); at the VA State Fair on Sept 29 or 30 and a day show on Nov 7th.

VN – They are having a schooling show on Aug 7 and two 1-day licensed shows Aug 28 & 29, all at Morven Park

Southwest – They are having a clinic with Jerry Schurink at VA Tech.

Southeast – They schooling shows are very successful and oversubscribed.

Other Business: VADA chapters fielded 7 teams at the Region 1 Youth Show in Culpepper June 26 & 27 and all did very well, winning champion or reserve in every division they entered. Plans are underway to hold the show again in 2022, probably in the same location.

Lisa Beckwith reported that the IEA (Interscholastic Equestrian Association) has expanded and has added a Region 3, which includes VA. They are enrolling riders for 2021-2022 Season. 

Riding with Carol - A scholarship report

As I have often said, "Each instructor brings a new tool to your Tool Box." That doesn't mean that every tool they give you, you use, it just means you've got something else that may, at some point be needed.

I started my lesson with Carol by telling her that my horse, Buddy, can do all the PSG movements and can do them well. But once we start putting the test together and we get to the canter, he gets very anxious. He puts his tongue over the bit and then I have nothing. Carol explained that in the case of the Curb bit (Weymouth) the flatter the bit the better, it should lay flat on their tongue. Going higher with the port will not fix the problem. Higher ports are for horses that have had tongue injuries. Also, as it turns out there is some confusion as to whether the French Mouth bit is a legal bit. This is because of the way USEF posted it in their most resent attachment on Tack (May 2021). The French Link is legal until 12/1, but it is not clear if that is 12/1/2020 or 12/1/2021. SVDA's TD has told me that it is legal until 12/1/2021 and is under review. A Bit Fitter I am working with says it is no longer legal. My advice, if this is the bit you are using now...find a new bit. I know, easier said than done. I'm right there with you I have to find a new bit too.



After the bit conversation I told her that Buddy hangs on the right rein and falls on his left shoulder. And that after the right pirouette he will slam his front end to the ground. Carol took a hard look at Buddy (remember he is half Draft) pointed at his lower neck (right before it ties into the chest) and said, "He's pushing with his neck and it's driving his front into the ground. We have to take his lower neck away from him." And so, we began...first by getting him to give at the base of his neck, (I know, everybody has this problem) and then to give his jaw and release the area in front of his shoulder up to his writhers. That part was not so easy. I had to flex right and wait for him to reach down and release the muscle, then push him left. Buddy had to figure out he could move forward and lift his shoulders. Buddy said "This I cannot do." It took a little pushing to get him to realize that he is capable of moving like this. Buddy wants to keep his front end tied to the dirt. Even when he is pushing from behind, he still not lifting in front like he is capable of. I'm getting half, I'm greedy, I want it all.

Now, all this is tied to the tongue over the bit, and now that we address the problem of using his shoulders not his neck the tongue over the bit become less of a problem.

Now, as we pick up with my second lesson with Carol, I explain I'm still having trouble with the right rein, but the bit problem (Tongue over the bit) is much better. (It had better be I just purchase two new bits to fix this problem, based on her information.) Carol promised me we would address that problem now, then asked me to pick up the reins and ask Buddy to come to the bit. Carol studied his neck for a moment and then pointed out where Buddy was not coming through. A spot just in front of his shoulders was not filled in. For a FEI rider this is the kiss of death (A little dramatic, I know) but if the horse does not fill that space correctly (And the judge sees that) you cannot get more than a 5.5 on your movement. *At FEI every point is important!* Getting Buddy to fill that space was important.

Also, Buddy wanted to step off with his front foot and leave his back feet in the next county. Carol would not let me move off until Buddy stepped off with the foot I picked. I had to tell her which foot I wanted and be most insistent that that was the foot Buddy stepped off with. Sounds easy, right. Not for Buddy, remember half Draft.

So, once we got through all that and actually started to trot Carol got after me about my half-halts. Seems I wasn't doing them properly. Okay, I get it, no one ever explained to me the proper way to do a half-halt because I got results doing it my way. Seems the proper way to do a half-halt is to roll your shoulder back to ask for the half-halt. Think of Matt Damon in The Martian, when he is driving the Mars Rover and listening to the disco music and rolling his shoulder. Like that. Good luck with that.
