#### 2021 CBLM CHAMPIONSHIPS at Carolina Horse Park

Monica and I have worked hard this year to get to this show and it really paid off. It has been a roller coaster ride with my musical Freestyle, some judges loved it and some preferred the more classical music. I love upbeat music so we went with the Meghan Trainor theme for our First Level ride. Well this crowd in NC loved it, the two judges loved it and we ended up with a 70.267% and Reserve Champion just .300% behind the Champions score...so close. This was my first victory gallop at a licensed show. I am kind of liking it!



We stabled in a barn with quite a few warmbloods which towered over Monica so she was adopted as their official mascot for the show by their owners who were all so sweet. If you have never gone to Carolina Horse Park, you must go. The footing is fabulous, the stalls are all open with great ventilation and nice rubber mats. So easy to keep your tack stalls clean.





Our second class on Friday was a regular class in Second Test 3. It was such a nice ride until Monica stumbled in the corner at the end of our three loop canter dropping that score to a 4 with a comment from the judge of "trotted, too bad". Still we received a 63.750% for a fourth place. Her turns on the haunches were great with scores of 7's. She does them so well.

On Saturday we rode our second championship class Second Test 2. This was another good ride with a few mistakes. I should have practiced our halts before going in. All three halts in this test she took steps back. She left out one step in her turn on the haunches and her last walk/canter departure at "A" she took the wrong lead. Her shoulder was too far off the track with the wrong bend. I should have corrected but she is always so good about her canter leads (don't take anything for granted). We corrected but still received two 4's from the judges giving us a final scores 62.744% for a sixth place. I am still very happy with her performance. She was a good pony this weekend.





Amanda came down with Sadie who has the same sire (Avanti) as Monica so I had to get a shot of them heading back to the barn.

I can't forget Kate Knick who came all the way down to coach Amanda Petroski so I took advantage of her presence to be our eyes on the ground for warm up on the second day. Thanks!!

Anne Draine made a motion to accept the July minutes, which was seconded by Laura Nelson and unanimously approved.

**Treasurer's Report** – Jessie reported that we have a combined balance of approximately \$200K. This doesn't reflect all the expenses of GAIG.

**2021 GAIGs:** Dianne thanked everyone who supported and volunteered at the show. She said that VHC was on their "A" game which was really appreciated as this was the largest region championship that we've run. The return of the Doggie Costume Contest was a big hit. We had 19 vendors and took in \$9680 in sponsorships. (Thank you Nancy Doody and Nancy Lowey!) Rachel Rice also thanked everyone who stepped up to volunteer. As a reminder, volunteer hours will be posted on the portal so there is no need to request hours but please make sure to check the report.

**2022 VADA Yearly Awards** – Nancy Doody reported that the forms and information can be found on the VADA website. Banquet reservations are entirely online this year with payment thru Paypal. As this is a plated lunch, we can't allow reservations after the deadline. The banquet will run from 11 till about 2. Sheli reported because of supply chain issues, there will only be a choice of two awards for licensed and schooling show champions. Reserve champion awards are still being determined. Joanne Collins requests that each chapter send her their chapter volunteer hours by December 1<sup>st</sup>. Fliers have been sent to chapter reps to disseminate to their members.

**USDF Convention-** Thanks in part to the letter Sheli composed to the USDF board, the convention will be virtual again this year. ### VADA Shel Gafford Memorial Award for EXCELLENCE IN SPORTMANSHIP Nomination deadline for 2021 Awards: December 1, 2021

For anyone not fortunate enough to have known Shel, he was not only a gifted horseman and successful competitor, but also a truly good sport and dedicated advocate to VADA. Shel was a seasoned competitor, having won the Gold and Silver Individual Medals in his last two years as a Young Rider at the NAYRC. He always rode to win, but never at the expense of his horse or another rider. Rather than "psyching" his fellow competitors, Shel was more likely to offer a helping hand or wish them luck. Furthermore, Shel was a tireless supporter of VADA. He served as President during some of our Association's most difficult and trying times. It is largely due to his diplomacy and tenacity that VADA exists as it does today.

It is this spirit of unselfish good sportsmanship and generous volunteerism, which were so much a part of Shel's nature, that VADA wishes to encourage and reward. If you are aware of a VADA member who is: 1) Actively involved in any aspect of competition and/or VADA activities (eg. Rider, owner, trainer, coach, show mom/dad, spouse, offspring, VADA Board Member, VADA volunteer), 2) who consistently exhibits the characteristics of good sportsmanship and unselfish support of VADA, and 3) has not received the Shel Gafford award within the past 10 years, please nominate that person for the Shel Gafford Award. Include in your nomination the person's name, chapter affiliation, and a brief statement (200 words or less) explaining why you feel your nominee is deserving of this award. Note that there is no requirement that each chapter submit a nomination or that a nominee be a member of the same chapter as the person submitting the nomination.

**Nominations must be received by December 1st.** The slate of nominees will be sent to the President of each Chapter, who shall, using the method they determine, poll the members of their Chapter and select their Chapter's choice for the award. In the event of a tie, the VADA Board of Directors shall select the winning nominee from the tied candidates. **Chapters MUST report their selections to Sheli King no later than January 15.** The recipient will receive a special award and a check for \$250.00.

# A Scholarship Report By Tammy Moore

Do you ever think, "If I had this kind of instruction everyday, just think of the progress I could make?" This weekend we braved the cold temperatures for a weekend full of learning and progress. We had the privilege to ride with Erin Brinkman with my 16 year old oldenburg mare Illyera. Illyera is currently schooling at 4th level. We went with the hopes to work on her straightness as she is often crooked and ended up with so many additional lessons.

We ended up talking about ways to ease her anxiety, focusing on relaxing her from the wither by moving the weight over her back leg and encouraging the hind leg to be able to come through without interference. It was really important not to just bend her, but in rhythm, and making sure that we move her rib into the receiving rein and slow down her shoulder.

Being a typical "red mare" or "adrenaline junkie," Illyera often shows anxiety in the collected work. At GAIGs, the overachieving mare often piaffed at the halt or jigged at the walk, causing scores to plummet. Erin and I worked on establishing the 4 beat walk, by slowing down the outside shoulder and really defining that rhythm at the walk. We added exercises like haunches in, walk pirouettes, and shoulder in to help establish the correct rhythm. At the halt, we worked on grounding her, and making her manage her own feet. Encouraging her to work out of the parasympathetic nervous system instead of the adrenaline will help ease her tension at work.

I was reminded how my upper left leg likes to grip and take up for the lack of coordination and strength of my right leg. At times I block her on the left side, while getting too light on the right side. It was also a good reminder that the leg has several quadrants that can be used depending on the desired outcome; whether it's the upper thigh or lower leg.

The other thing we worked on is becoming an active participant in the ride. When I rode with George Williams and Bill Warren this past summer, we had talked about riding the horse that is with you now, not the horse of even 5 days ago. Illyera had some past dental issues, and she has trained me to be almost too quiet at times. Now that she is becoming a bit more willing to move into the outside reins, fixing her stability at times is now an option, rather than stiffening up and not helping her balance. It was a change of thinking to not be afraid to add the collected frame from the extended, and controlling the anxiety by establishing the rhythm.

I thoroughly look forward to trying to incorporate some of the exercises into my daily routine and would love to ride with Erin Brinkman again! Thank you SVDA and Erin for the opportunity!



# Riding with Carol Part two - A scholarship report

In the next two clinics with Carol we would start off by working on the stuff we had already done, first getting him to give at the base of his neck, jaw release and then lift his shoulder up, getting him out of the dirt. And last stepping off on the hide foot of my choosing. This last part became very important in this lesson. Because not only did my horse now have to step off on the correct foot, he had to put it under my seat. (A bit like a leg yield, but going nowhere.) This was very hard at first, because my horse just wants to give you any answer to the question, not necessarily the correct answer. Very much like the class clown in school who wasn't paying attention in class and the teacher calls on him and he give the teacher a glib answer. But the horse soon understood the question and found the answer, by placing his foot under my seat. This pushed the power up to his shoulders and he came to the bit on his own. The left was easy the right not so much. He did eventually get there. From there we would trot and then canter, whenever he lost the self-carriage we went back and started over. It wasn't long before my horse had figure out the plan.

So, to sum up my rides with Carol it was all about getting the horse to work each part of his body independently and then put them together.
