



Raleigh Labor of Love I & II

Traveling to licensed shows is always more fun with a group of riders to share everything with, your worries, any helpful hints and of course how hard the judges are scoring everyone. Well Monica loves Raleigh and usually does quite well so I signed up for this two day show only to find out later that the group of riders I usually stable with were not going...none of them. I also heard that through the grapevine that there were going to be some really tough judges there but, too late, I had already sent my entry in. So Friday morning we packed up and headed to Raleigh. Found out when we got there that we were stabled next to Amanda Harper and her big boy Darry and on the other side were all the Gypsy Vanner folks. So we had quite a lively bunch of folks around us.

Friday afternoon Monica was her usual self, looking at everything and trying her best to ignore me. In the end we had really good workouts in both the rings we were going to show in. That evening while braiding I recognized a voice behind our stall wall...it was Jim Koford. So I hollered a hello to him, reminding him who I was. He was with quite a few students.

So my first ride, MFS, was in the indoor Ring 1. She wasn't as attentive or uphill as I would have liked her to be but we still got a decent score of 69.5%. My helper for the weekend, Deb Sweetman was on her phone getting score updates even before I knew what they were. After we heard how tough the judge was scoring in Ring 2, Deb starting peaking at the scores of the riders under her...lots of high 50"s. Of course she was my afternoon judge. I got Monica out early and I discussed with her that we needed to be on our "A" game for the next ride. I might have schooled her too long but we still managed a 62.5% for Second test 3.

Day two we started with our MFS. All I kept telling Deb was that I wanted to break into the 70 percentile on my MFS at these licensed shows. It had been a year of riding that MFS at licensed shows and I was still in the high 60's. So we went into that ring with seriousness written all over us, no goofiness Monica or looking at everything. We must stay focused! It felt like a really great ride to me but you never know. The crowd sure cheered at lot at the end of our ride. Well as Deb was in deep concentration looking for scores, a big grin came on her face. WE DID IT, 74.5%! Found out when I got home that the judge for that ride was a FEI Four Star judge.

Ok last ride for the weekend, Second test 3, we rode very collected, uphill, correct bends and got a 65.833%...SUPER HAPPY! Monica has perfected canter/walk trans., half turns on haunches, Travers, shoulder-in and rein back. We still have more work to get higher scores on our medium trot and canter and to get my shoulders square and back more.

To add a lighter moment to the show, there was also breed classes at the far end of the grounds. When chilling between classes I heard this unusual noise. So we looked down the stall row and there was this two year old mule. So adorable and the owner pointed out the unique smell to their coats. They don't smell like horses but it is a very nice smell. Anyway, so cute.

So everyone work hard, don't give up, the uphill climb is not an easy one but so worth the rewards when they come your way.

VADA MINUTES – September 14, 2021, via Zoom

The meeting was called to order at 8:02 with representatives of all chapters except ShenVADA.

Participating: Angela Stanaway (North East); Sheli King (VN); Sherri Booye (Charlottesville); Sandy Toby (Southeast); Bettina Longaker (Charlottesville); Anna Fox (Fredericksburg); Anne Draine (North East); Laura Nelson (Southwest); Alison Douglas (Central); Jessie Ginsburg (NOVA), Diann Carpenter (NOVA) and members Nancy Doody, Dianne Boyd & Rachel Rice, Lisa Beckwith

Anne Draine made a motion to accept the July minutes, which was seconded by Sheli King and unanimously approved.

Treasurer's Report – Jessie reported that we have a combined balance of approximately \$133K. No financial review of DAL or chapter challenge has yet been completed.

Chapter Challenge – Sandy Toby reported that the show went very smoothly. She had lots of volunteers. She did note that to break even we need to run two rings. The board discussed the viability of the show and whether it is still serving the purpose for which it was intended. Chapter reps are tasked with discussing the subject at the chapter level and reporting back with alternative ideas or ways to increase participation.

2021 GAIGs: Kathy Grisolia will be the co-manager with Diane. Diane reported that we will be running at least 7 rings with the possibility of adding an 8th. There will be 3 championship rings with the availability of a 4th if we need one. Therefore, **WENEED A LOT OF VOLUNTEERS.** Please contact Rachel Rice at <u>volvada@gmail.com</u>. The same protocols as last year will be in place for awards. Masks will be required in the show office and coliseum and strongly encouraged in the barn area regardless of vaccination status. We will be having the doggy costume contest and the competitor's party. The competitors party will be held outside in the pavilion area as VHC will be doing a complex dedication for the DD ring. There will also be a dessert party in the vendor area during the Saturday evening freestyles. Volunteer hospitality will be upstairs. Lunches will be box lunches provided by VHC with the addition of soup from Allison Campbell. Nancy Doody reported that we are doing well with sponsorships although there are a few chapters that haven't submitted. We will also have a good number of vendors, all of whom will be inside. Morning coffee cart for competitors will also be held this year.

2022 VADA Yearly Awards – Jessie gave the committee report (thank you Nancy Doody for organizing the committee meeting) and the following recommendations:

- We hold the board meeting at a separate date and time instead of having it before the banquet. It's difficult for those on the board who also have banquet duties to manage both, and the board meeting gets rushed.
- We publish the results beforehand. The purpose here is twofold errors can be caught and also, we can then offer a selection of prizes that can be chosen beforehand (similar to the VIP awards with a shopping cart for options)
- We have a backup person review the placings as a second set of eyes.
- We require a photo with awards submissions so we have them for the presentation and don't have to hunt people down.

A motion was made by Sheri and seconded by Anne Draine that we announce the winners beforehand so that champion and reserve prizes can be selected a la carte. The motion passed unanimously.

A motion was made by Jessie and seconded by Laura Nelson that we hold the board meeting in which we elect the executive board within a week prior to the banquet. The motion passed unanimously.

The next committee meeting will be held the first week in October.

USDF Convention- Based upon our membership numbers, we have three GMO reps. The convention is in Houston and reps would be required to attend the BOG meeting so would need to be there the 2nd thru the 4th of December. There was discussion by the board about COVID and mask concerns with Texas as the venue. Tina will submit our concerns at the USDF board meeting she has later this week.

"Get To Know Your Members" - We will start having a section on the website where chapters can take turns submitting blurbs on the interesting non-horsey jobs or activities of their members.

Other Business: Rachel Rice will be taking over the VIP year end awards. Nancy Doody has constructed a "special events" page on the website where activities that might interest members but aren't VADA related can be posted. Contact her for more information.

NEVADA – Schooling show at the VA State Fair on Sept 29 or 30 and a day show on Nov 7th.


NOVA – Schooling show championship will be held in November.

2021 CBLM CHAMPIONSHIPS at Carolina Horse Park

Monica and I have worked hard this year to get to this show and it really paid off. It has been a roller coaster ride with my musical Freestyle, some judges loved it and some preferred the more classical music. I love up beat music so we went with the Meagan Trainor theme for our First Level ride. Well this crowd in NC loved it, the two judges loved it and we ended up with a 70.267% and Reserve Champion just .300% behind the Champions score...so close. This was my first victory gallop at a licensed show. I am kind of liking it!



We stabled in a barn with quite a few warmbloods which towered over Monica so she was adopted as their official mascot for the show by their owners who were all so sweet. If you have never gone to Carolina Horse Park, you must go. The footing is fabulous, the stalls are all open with great ventilation and nice rubber mats. So easy to keep your tack stalls clean.





Our second class on Friday was a regular class in Second Test 3. It was such a nice ride until Monica stumbled in the corner at the end of our three loop canter dropping that score to a 4 with a comment from the judge of "trotted, too bad". Still we received a 63.750% for a fourth place. Her turns on the haunches were great with scores of 7's. She does them so well.

On Saturday we rode our second championship class Second Test 2. This was another good ride with a few mistakes. I should have practiced our halts before going in. All three halts in this test she took steps back. She left out one step in her turn on the haunches and her last walk/canter departure at "A" she took the wrong lead. Her shoulder was too far off the track with the wrong bend. I should have corrected but she is always so good about her canter leads (don't take anything for granted). We corrected but still received two 4's from the judges giving us a final scores 62.744% for a sixth place. I am still very happy with her performance. She was a good pony this weekend.





Amanda came down with Sadie who has the same sire (Avanti) as Monica so I had to get a shot of them heading back to the barn.

I can't forget Kate Knick who came all the way down to coach Amanda Petroski so I took advantage of her presence to be our eyes on the ground for warm up on the second day. Thanks!!

For anyone not fortunate enough to have known Shel, he was not only a gifted horseman and successful competitor, but also a truly good sport and dedicated advocate to VADA. Shel was a seasoned competitor, having won the Gold and Silver Individual Medals in his last two years as a Young Rider at the NAYRC. He always rode to win, but never at the expense of his horse or another rider. Rather than "psyching" his fellow competitors, Shel was more likely to offer a helping hand or wish them luck. Furthermore, Shel was a tireless supporter of VADA. He served as President during some of our Association's most difficult and trying times. It is largely due to his diplomacy and tenacity that VADA exists as it does today.

It is this spirit of unselfish good sportsmanship and generous volunteerism, which were so much a part of Shel's nature, that VADA wishes to encourage and reward. Rider, owner, trainer, coach, show mom/dad, spouse, offspring, VADA Board Member, VADA volunteer), 2) who consistently exhibits the characteristics of good sportsmanship and unselfish support of VADA, and 3) has not received the Shel Gafford award within the past 10 years, please nominate that person for the Shel Gafford Award. Include in your nomination the person's name, chapter affiliation, and a brief statement (200 words or less) explaining why you feel your nominee is deserving of this award. Note that there is no requirement that each chapter submit a nomination or that a nominee be a member of the same chapter as the person submitting the nomination.

Nominations must be received by December 1st. The slate of nominees will be sent to the President of each Chapter, who shall, using the method they determine, poll the members of their Chapter and select their Chapter's choice for the award. In the event of a tie, the VADA Board of Directors shall select the winning nominee from the tied candidates. Chapters MUST report their selections to Sheli King no later than January 15. The recipient will receive a special award and a check for \$250.00.


