THE THORSTEN KRAMER CLINIC

The Thorsten Kramer Clinic was held at Seahorse Run on March 2 and March 3, 2019. I previously attended the Wanja Gerlach clinic and he said my horse was too forward. There will be another article in Newsletter about that clinic. I asked Thorsten if he agreed with Wanja. He said, yes but in an up and down manner meaning my horse was not using enough hind end. She is too short strided, you need to lengthen the stride and she won't be so up and down. We are here to fix this problem today. She gets stuck behind. In the above photo, he took a crop with a ball on the end of it and tapped on my horse's barrel to mimic my leg. He did this till she accepted it and started stepping underneath herself along with moving forward. He then got on her to see if she understood and she was getting the concept.

I also got on and he made me hold my leg on her till she gave in and did what I was asking. My horse got a little temperamental and threw a TB hucklebuck with pinned ears to show her opinion, but I kept my leg on till she did what she was supposed to then took my leg off. It was a great learning experience and I have been working on this at home. This was a great clinic at a wonderful facility.

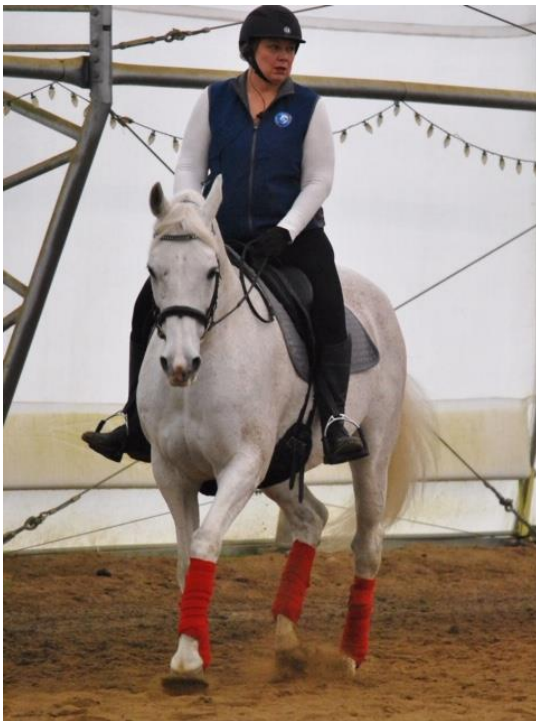

THE WANJA GERLACH CLINIC

The Wanja Gerlach clinic was held at Briar Glen Riding Academy on February 24, 2019. Wanja is an L judge and is also a gold medalist whose origin is German. In this clinic I learned that my horse was unbalanced on the circle. She tends to throw the outside shoulder out which in turn is an unbalanced movement. Initially, she was hot and tense, so we did a lot of walking to get her to relax along with some leg yielding.

To correct the unbalanced shoulder move, he had me clench my ring finger on the rein. When my horse ignored this cue, he made me counter flex her and keep her walking on the circle for five to six steps, then straight, and then ask again with the ring finger. This maneuver helped balance my horse out easily on the circle, but we worked on it for a while. The ring finger maneuver also helped steady my contact on the outside rein which I sometimes let get away from me. He did think my horse was too forward, so we did leg yields to lengthen the stride and we didn't have very much time to work on this because we mainly worked on balance and relaxation. I enjoyed this clinic!! The indoor and hospitality was fabulous considering all the horrible weather.

- Treasurer report

 - Robyn would like another credit card made - will discuss further with Evelyn
 - Evelyn is finishing up 2018 P&L statement
 - SVDA tax filing due May
 - With our new QuickBooks program, we have computer generated checks. Use reimbursement form along with receipts for any reimbursements requests.
- Awards –
 - Cookie will forward report within the week
 - Looking toward next award ceremony:
 - AV will be a little more expensive. Venue will be \$250
 - Same venue for next year okay – yes per group
 - Theme for next year? Board voted no theme
- Clinics
 - Bonnie Gruber Clinic 4/27
 - Kelly Coyne clinic full (2/3 at Wellington)
 - For the Thorsten Cramer – Should SVDA cover \$20 of \$100 ride? Robyn reminded the group of the insurance cost over and above. Keep as \$100 for riders (members) so SVDA pays \$25 per rider. Unknown if transportation is included with that cost (3/2 and 3/3 at Seahorse). Beth to look into mileage before we decide - she will send an email so we can vote via email
 - Need application for chapter grant \$1800 for 2018 and 2019
- Membership
 - Current members = 60 (a few are pending per what came in at banquet)
 - Rate increase for 202 of \$5 because the USDF fees are going up on Primary and Individual GMO memberships. Secondary memberships will not be affected
- Newsletter
 - No update – Sara reminded everyone that submissions are due by 25th of month
 - Re: \$5 rate increase – start running an ad campaign early (October suggested) to encourage people to register before 1/1/2020 to save he \$5
 - Robyn got list of volunteer for test clinic and will provide to Sara 1/28
 - If there are edits to be done, to let her know
- Website
 - Wendy absent - she has updated the 2019 board list on website. Carol updates membership application.
 - Toni waiting for the volunteer form to be updated (there is a mis-spelling and Toni is still listed as contact - should be changed to Robyn)

- Scholarship
 - 2017 – Julie Shilling has been paid \$130 to date and Ann Jacobson is complete
 - 2018 – Lora Gibson complete; Robyn Nunnally complete; Lorna Parsons has been paid \$240 to date and will be using the balance in 2019
 - Discussion ensued regarding extensions on the scholarships so they don't keep rolling over. Policy states 12 months, which will be updated on the form and in the manual.
 - Apps due 4/1 - need to have a meeting right after that
- Juniors
 - Banquet silent auction brought in \$1141.00
 - Chapter Challenge - need location and can they do JR challenge? (@ Morven park). Beth and Robyn to go to VADA meeting next week and they will see what the plans are. Possible Culpepper show for Janine – enough volunteers are the issue. If Janine does it, she needs help for sponsors and gifts and volunteers etc.
 - Juniors will do concessions at schooling shows if a vendor does not come out (to be done on a show by show basis). Concessions would be basic...easy to transport and store. Could be done on honor system
- Schooling shows
 - Champ show to be held in Wakefield Sunday, 10/27/19 – will benefit our competitors as stabling is available and it follows a Wakefield Western Dressage Series show the previous day. Great opp to ride in two shows in ne weekend
 - Promote heavily in newsletter ahead of time
 - Stall charge to be raised from \$25 to \$30 to cover other extra charges
 - Fun ideas were tossed around for activities: Try to get a sponsor to raise dollars to entice people to come, parents lead-line class, party, pizza party, costume contest etc
 - We will be adding the USDF Sport Horse breeding Stock (in-Hand) test to the list of classes offered at SVDA schooling shows in 2019 (attachment)
 - Sara to add to newsletter and Tomi to advise judges that it will be added
 - Cookie asked if we will have extra safety people for bigger shows? Robyn to contact Sussex County Sherriff for Wakefield show re: responses times and service. Weekend Wakefield staffed with volunteers
 - Pinky mentioned that we need to try to publish ride times by Wednesday on the website
 - For champ show - Cookie to check with Jessica Stallings about prize donations and ideas
 - Sarkozi Training Centre and Princess Anne farms have declined to host SVDA schooling shows in 2019
 - Waiting to hear from Shanna Sloan about hosting a show at Amazing Grace in July
 - River Birch Equestrian Center in Courtland has been suggested as a possible venue – will follow up as a possibility for May
 - Carlton Farms in Williamsburg has expressed interest in hosting shows and clinics for SVDA, but there is concern that it is too far to travel for competitors
 - Ribbons have been ordered and received
 - Current schedule posted on Agenda
- Ways and Means –
 - Katherine Gardner would like to be involved in selling SVDA merchandise at shows
 - Lots of merchandise left over – Krista can post to the FB page, or sell at shows/clinics (see previous bullet). She suggested providing volunteer credit for those selling the merchandise
 - Krista is working on a sponsorship brochure and levels to post to the website – she will provide to the Board when complete
 - Krista can place orders for other promotional items, but she does require 1 month advanced notice, and would use the internet due to better pricing
 - Any other fundraising Ideas? Pass along to Krista

- New business
 - New In-Hand Class
 - Robyn stated that the use of cones have not been needed in the past for the triangle - just standing at mid-point is needed. She suggests keeping it simple.
 - Pinky asked about being prepared with having stallions - no worries - 18 yo . and over. Handlers must be wearing helmet. Robyn to pull and post rules to newsletter.
 - In-Hand is just offered as a class currently. This is a test for now.
 - SVDA will do 2 and under and 3 and over for this series.
 - Charge for class: \$10 for pre-entries only (no at show registrations).
 - To be done as last class of the day.
 - This will be a trial year - not eligible for year-end awards
 - Sanctioned shows
 - Increase from \$75 or \$100? Board voted on \$75 Cookie 2nd
 - Minimum of 2 out of 6 scores need to be from SVDA and will only be for ribbon awards. Passed by Board (to be updated on website and in Manual)
- Next meeting to be in April 4/9 and will be an 8PM call

Whip Facts:

One whip may be carried in all national classes except at USEF/USDF Championships. ("Local" championships may allow whips if so stated in the prizelist.)

Maximum whip length is 47.2 inches, or 120cm. This measurement includes the lash. A lash is not required but if present, is included in the measurement. For FEI Pony tests, maximum whip length is 100cm. There is no rule regarding the minimum length of a whip.

No attachments other than a lash are allowed on whips - no plastic bags, noisemakers, etc.

Adjustable length whips are not allowed.

These rules apply to the warm up and competition areas; competitors showing in USEF/USDF Championships are allowed to warm up with a whip, but it must be dropped prior to entering the competition area.

Whips are measured for appropriate length as part of a standard equipment check after tests are ridden. Riders may request that a whip be measured prior to testing or before starting their warm up.

Use of illegal whips or using a whip in a USEF/USDF Championship class will result in elimination from that class.

Junior Corner For April

Hello All:

I am the Junior Team Coordinator for SVDA. I am looking for junior/young riders to participate in the team for this year. It looks like there will not be an official Region 1 Junior/Young Rider Team Championship show this year. As an alternative, we are forming a junior/young rider team to go to the Virginia Summer Dressage show in Culpeper, VA on June 16-17 for a "fun" and informal Jr/YR Team Challenge competition, which is similar to the Pro-Am Team Challenge that is held at all licensed shows. There will be NO FEES for participation, but there will be prizes for the top three teams. Rosenberg Events hosted the Junior/Young Rider Team Competition in 2017 as part of their Culpeper Licensed show and we were able to send a team. I know everyone had fun and there are intro level opportunity classes, opportunity training level classes as well as regular classes. You would not need an active membership if you are doing the opportunity or intro level classes.

No USEF/USDF memberships or Horse ID required for Intro or Opportunity Classes. Opportunity classes are also exempt from \$23 USEF fee. Jr/YR Team Challenge will have 3-4 Jr/YRs per team. Prizes to top three teams awarded on Saturday. JR/YR - Open to Juniors and Young Riders only; any rider is eligible until the end of the calendar year in which they reach the age of 21. Only riders ages 14-18 may ride FEI JR Tests. Only riders age 16-21 may ride FEI YR Tests. Only riders ages 12-16 may ride FEI Pony Tests. Only riders ages 12-14 may ride FEI Children Tests.

We will need to fund raise more money than last year as the cost of this show will be about \$450 per horse/rider combination.

I would like to have a meeting to discuss the details and see who is interested in attending. I would like to have the meeting April 26th at 6:00pm or April 27th at 1:00pm at my house. Please forward this email onto any other perspective junior/young riders.

Peter Nordlander Clinic Notes By Anna Schriebl

In March, I had the pleasure of auditing a clinic by Peter Nordlander at the beautiful Wellington Farm in Virginia Beach, VA. Peter's kind classical approach produced very positive changes in the rider and horse teams from the beginning of the lesson to the end.

Peter stressed the training pyramid stating a horse in good rhythm will also be relaxed and in better balance. During trot and canter work, Peter had several riders work on suppling the ribcage by moving from haunches-in to shoulder-in on the quarter line and minded the riders to position to the inside but allow the outside rein to follow so the horse could bend.

He also encouraged the riders to keep their horse's neck supple so that the horse didn't brace the neck against the rider's hands. Peter encouraged riders of tense horses to pat the horse with the outside rein while positioning them slightly to the inside. Reminding the riders that there is no push from the hindquarters without a connect to the reins, he stated that he may do 32-34 half-halts on one circle alone. He also instructed riders to stay on the same track on the circle and not to have their horse's forehand and hindquarters move on two separate tracks.

When working in the canter, Peter **asked** the riders to ride forward to help the horse become less stiff but not to allow them to run away. He explained that the canter came "from the body" and should be forward and uphill and not "like a pogo-stick". He encouraged riders to increase flexion to the inside to supple the horse's ribcage.

When working with one rider on their flying changes, he asked them to ride a serpentine the entire width of the arena and make the change over the centerline. He instructed the rider to count the strides before the change and to be "more with the strides" and be more mindful of the change and the preparation for it.

Peter's positive and pro-horse approach was a refreshing change from trainers who ask too much too soon. He reminded riders to be happy with their horses and not to over-challenge them. "Horses must also be your best friend", he stated and reminded riders to find a way to teach horses where they can remain your friend.

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 pm

A motion was made by Sandy Toby and seconded by Diane Nathan to accept the minutes from the last meeting. It passed unanimously.

Treasurer's report: Jessie reported that the combined balances are around 141K. The total awards banquet expenses were \$10878.79. The facility expense alone was \$5554.54 only offset \$3080 with income from the reservations. Because there were several issues with the facility, we will be looking for a new venue for next year. The online and silent auctions brought in \$3K. Jessie will not be running the online auction for next year so we will need another volunteer. To increase donations, later this year we will be asking chapters to designate a member who will be in charge of soliciting donations from their chapter area. Jessie discussed that the Purple Book cost us \$2848.71 equating to \$4.42 per book which is less than last year's cost of \$4.73 per book. Ad revenue was \$505. Discussion was held regarding whether we continue to publish, and the consensus was that it is useful to members and will be even more so next year to advertise schooling shows as in 2020 USDF will be starting the schooling show awards program.

Updates from the Region 1 meeting- Youth Team competition will be held in NJ Oct 5-6. Adult Team competition will be held Nov 9-10 in Upper Marlboro, MD by PVDA. PVDA is also hosting the L program this year. DAL will have L testing out of FL. The omnibus will be advertising both shows and clinics. Shows are \$50 and clinics are \$10. The contact is Penny Hawes at USDFRegion1Omnibus@gmail.com. For 2020, the omnibus will also advertise schooling shows. The USDF convention will be held in Savannah, GA Dec 4-7. PM delegates need to declare by April 15th.

2020 USDF Schooling Show Award Program- VADA will be reimbursing chapters for the \$25 per show fee. The board will be voting in an upcoming meeting on how many shows to reimburse and is seeking feedback from chapters. This will only be for chapter run schooling shows NOT shows that chapters sanction from other organizations. Please note the distinction. 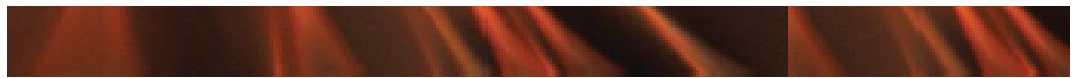

Dressage Sport Horse Breeding Stock (In-Hand) Classes

Particular USDF Rules

- Horses of one sex may not be judged against those of the opposite sex except in specified Group classes, Championship classes or special classes for single breeds or amateur/junior/young rider handlers.
- A horse shall be disqualified for unsoundness (at the judge's discretion in Breeding Stock and Group classes). In Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes, unsoundness is defined as showing evidence of lameness or broken wind. Refer to DR119.1 regarding loss of sight.
- Following a posted or announced order, an entry will walk to the apex of the triangle, and await the judge's request to proceed on the triangle. The handler will lead the horse on the perimeter of the triangle at walk and trot, returning to the apex to stand for conformation judging. Conformation is judged before and/or after movement. Repetition of all or any part of the movement on the triangle is allowed only at the judge's request.
- After all horses have been shown on the triangle, some or all may be recalled to be shown in groups at a walk and trot. If horses may be recalled, the prize list or program must state that this procedure will be used.
- When two or more judges are officiating, they may agree to use the same score sheets and agree on each score before informing the scorer, or they may judge independently. Class cards alone are not permitted for individual in-hand classes.
- The judge(s) must excuse from the ring any unruly horse or one whose actions threaten to endanger handlers, officials, other exhibitors or their entries.
- Scores must be reported as a total based on the percentage allowed in each judging category, against a possible total of 100%, and all scores and placings may be published. Unofficial scores may be published during the class and/or final scores may be published at the end of each class. Decimals may be used in scoring.
- Tied scores shall be broken first by relating to movement scores. If still tied, the tie may be broken at the judge's discretion, by the use of decimals, or the horses may be examined again (movement only). If a class is judged by more than one judge, the judges may consult and arrive at one agreed upon placement. (Ties in USDFBC Finals classes will remain tied.) Bonding is optional. Bondages of any kind are forbidden during a class.
- Stables are mandatory on two-year olds and older. Bondages are forbidden on foals and weanlings. A bridle shall consist of a snaffle type bit (see DR121, Figure 1A) with two reins and headstall with throatlatch. Reins must be attached only to bits as described in DR121.6. Noseband is optional. A split or single chain may be used instead of or in addition to reins, however a lead shank is required if reins are placed over the horse's neck and the handler must hold the shank.
- The handler, assistant handler and/or a whip assistant may each carry only one whip, or one standard lungeing whip (without attachments, i.e. plastic bags, etc.). In addition, disruptive noisemaking devices are not permitted in the competition ring.
- Conservative sports attire is recommended for handlers, assistant handlers and whip assistants. Handlers, assistant handlers and whip assistants of any age must wear protective headgear as defined by DR205 while handling or assisting in the competition ring.
- Each horse, including non-competing mares accompanying foals, must have a separate handler or assistant at all times.
- The competition veterinarian must be available to the judge, if on the premises, and the handler must give permission to the judge and/or veterinarian before either touches the horse. If the veterinarian is not immediately available, or not called upon, the judge's decision as to the serviceable soundness of a horse must be final.
- Assistant handlers may not show a horse at the trot (except for horses not being judged but accompanying a mare or foal that is being judged).
- No horse that is not being judged may accompany another horse in the ring while being judged, except for a mare accompanying a foal or vice versa.
- Unauthorized assistance by individuals outside the competition ring is not permitted.

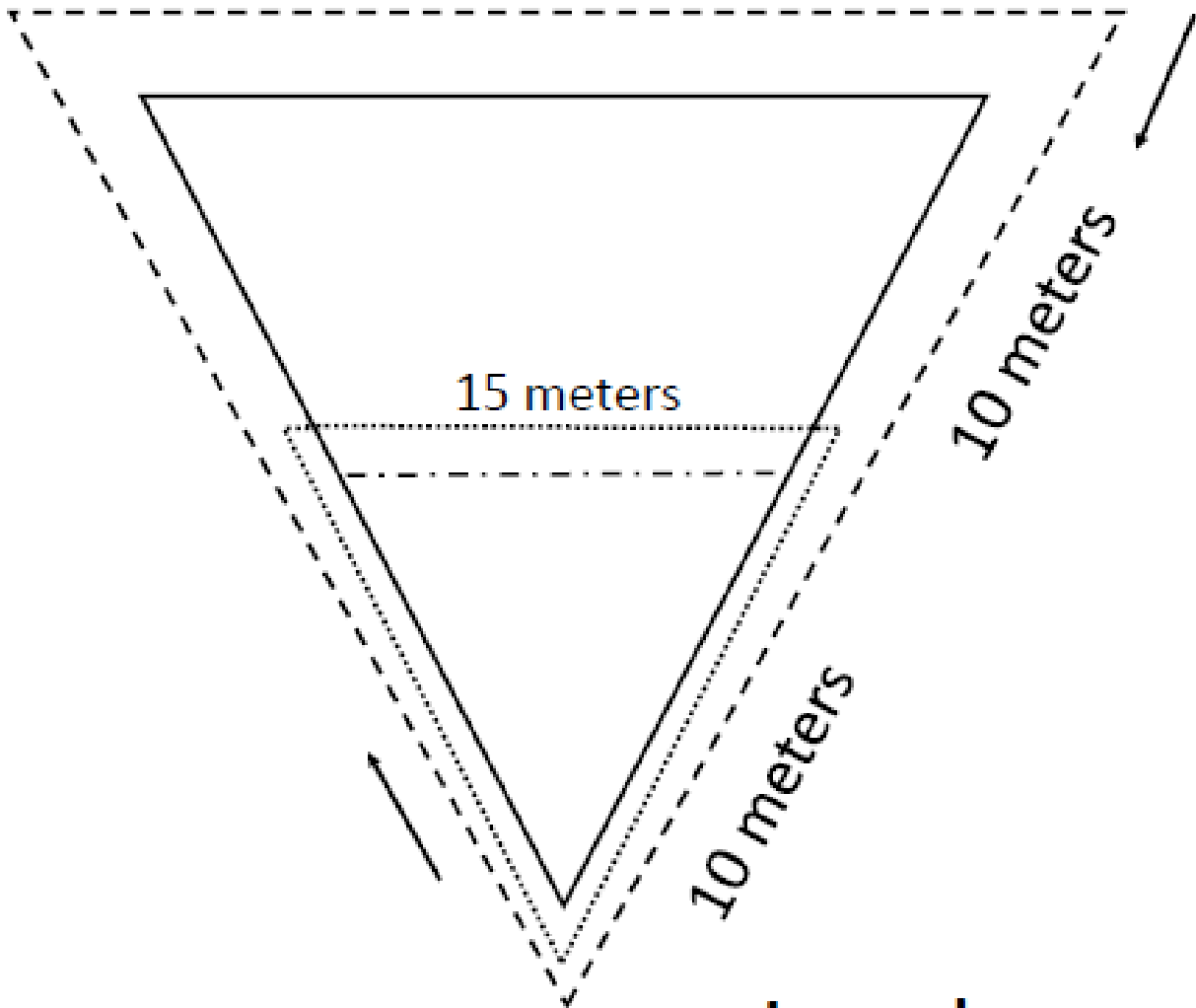

Airfield Conference Center (Airfield) ASSUMPTION OF RISK, RELEASE AND INDEMNIFICATION This document waives very important legal rights. Read it carefully before signing.

In consideration for Airfield Conference Center permitting me to participate in this Competition, and by signing the entry blank, I agree as follows:
I AGREE that I choose to participate voluntarily in this Competition, as a rider, driver, handler, lessee, owner, agent, coach, trainer, junior exhibitor, or as a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor. **I AM FULLY AWARE AND ACKNOWLEDGE THAT HORSE SPORTS AND PARTICIPATION IN THIS COMPETITION INVOLVE SERIOUS RISK OF HARM INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, RISKS OF ACCIDENT, SERIOUS BODILY INJURY, INCLUDING DEATH, BROKEN BONES, HEAD INJURIES, TRAUMA, PAIN, AND SUFFERING, AND PROPERTY DAMAGE. I ASSUME ALL RISKS OF HARM TO ME, MY HORSE OR MY PROPERTY.**

I AGREE for myself, my heirs, executors, administrators, successors and assigns to release Airfield Conference Center(Airfield), Virginia Polytechnic Institute and State University (Virginia Tech), the Competition, the facilities leased by the Competition and the owner(s) of the facilities, and all of their respective officers, officials, directors, employees, agents, personnel, volunteers, affiliated organizations and insurers (collectively, the "Released Parties") from any and all claims for damage, loss, or injury to myself, other persons, horses or other property belonging to me to the fullest extent permitted by law that arises out of or relates in any way to the Competition and my participation in the Competition **INCLUDING, BUT NOT LIMITED TO, DAMAGES, LOSS, OR INJURY RESULTING FROM ANY ACTS, FAILURE TO ACT, NEGLIGENCE OR NEGLECT OF OTHER ENTRANTS, THE RELEASED PARTIES, THEIR CONTRACTORS OR INVITEES**, as well as for theft, vandalism, fire, other casualty damage, or damage arising out of any defects in the premises.

By signing below as a parent or guardian of a junior exhibitor, I consent to the child's participation and agree to all of the above provisions, and further agree to assume all of the obligations of this Airfield Assumption of Risk, Release and Indemnification personally and on behalf of the child.

This Airfield Assumption of Risk, Release and Indemnification is governed by the Laws of the State of Virginia and is intended to be interpreted as broadly as possible. I agree that exclusive jurisdiction and venue (place) for any legal action against Airfield, Virginia Tech, its officers, directors, employees, volunteers or agents shall be in the local district courts or the federal court of the State of Virginia. If any part of this agreement is determined to be unenforceable, all other parts shall remain effect.

I AGREE to expressly assume all risks of Harm to me or my horse, including Harm resulting from the negligence the Competition. I AGREE to indemnify (that is, to pay any losses, damages, or costs incurred by)the Competition and to hold them harmless with respect to claims for Harm to me or my horse, and for claims made by others for any Harm caused by me or my horse while at the Competition. I am entitled to wear protective equipment without penalty, and I acknowledge that Airfield strongly encourages me to do so while WARNING that no protective equipment can guard against all injuries. All junior exhibitors 18 & under must wear a protective helmet.
