WHAT DO ALL THOSE LETTERS MEAN?

We see judges listed with a Letter (L with D, L, r, R, S or FEI***, FEI**** or FEI*****) after their names. Lots of people ask – what's with all the letters, what do they mean?

Dressage is one of the FEW sports that require that you have competed at or above the level that you are applying to judge at. And your “success” has to be documented by a certain number of scores – (usually 5) above 62 to 65 (depends on the level you are applying for). This is just to be able to apply for the programs. You must go in order of the letters (no skipping levels!)

The first rung of the ladder is the “L” program run through USDF. Part 1 is 3 different sessions (each 1 weekend long) where you attend lectures, watch and judge both videos and live horse demonstrations. Part 1 is open to anyone who wants to learn more about dressage, there are no requirements to attend and many people attend just to improve their knowledge!

After completion of Part 1 as a participant, if you have the necessary riding scores at 2nd LL or above you can apply to be in Part 2. This is 2 more weekends of practice judging in a structured program, additional weekends fulfilling scribing and sitting hours and a 3rd weekend with a written and practical judging exam. Successfully passing the L program earns you an “L Grad” after your name.. Passing with a 72% or higher gains you an “L Grad with Distinction”.

“L” Grads are not referred to as judges because there is no certification or license – but they are well equipped and well-trained to judge schooling shows through 2nd Level. L Grads frequently get practice judging all levels in schooling shows and often Gaited and Western Dressage as well. All L grads are required to do 8 hours of Continuing Education in order to stay listed with USDF on their website and to be eligible to judge a schooling show that in 2020 be offering the new USDF Schooling Show Regional Awards. SVDA requires the use of L Grads (or USEF Judges) and we prefer the L grads that are “Current” meaning they have done their CE requirements.

If you successfully receive an “L Grad with Distinction” AND you have 5 Riding scores at 65% or higher at 4th LL – you may submit an application to USEF to be accepted into the “r” program. “r” stands for Recorded Judge. This program takes a year to complete – you start with approximately 3 days of formal lectures and practice judging. You will spend 4 or more weekends throughout the year doing apprentice work often in groups with other “r” candidates. Approximately a year later you will have both a written and practical exam again. When you successfully earn your USEF “r” you now have your first judging license and are eligible to judge USEF Licensed shows through 2nd Level.

Moving on to apply for the “R” (Registered Judge) Program requires a minimum of 2 years as a “r” and riding scores above 65% at PSG or higher. The program is similar to what is required in the “r” program with formal education, group apprentice work and exams. “R” judge are licensed to judge USEF Licensed Shows through 4th LL.

The highest rung on our National Judging Scale is the “S” which stands for Senior judge. After judging a certain amount as an “R” and having achieved the required 5 scores at Grand Prix – now you can now apply for the “S” program. The program is similar with the formal lectures and practice, much group apprenticing and an exam over approximately a year's time. Once successful now you can judge all USEF National competitions through Grand Prix.

Every “r”, “R” and “S” judge is required to do 8 hours of continuing education every 3 years. Most of us do MUCH more than that. (I personally go every year) Its important to stay current and learn from our most experienced judges. You also will want to earn your * Freestyle Designation, *Equitation Designation and for “S” Judges the *Young Horse designation.

There are separate Sport Horse Judges at both the “r” and “R” levels. They are licensed to judge the breeding classes and have separate application requirements, training and exams.

But you say you want more? Now you enter the realm of the FEI JUDGE. These applications go through USEF but are approved and administered by the FEI. You will have more training and testing around the world.

So if you think this sounds time consuming and expensive, you would be right! The judge training programs in the United States are recognized world wide as one of the best judge training programs in the world. People like Marilyn Heath, Maryanna Ludwig, Edgar Hotz, and Maryal Barnett who started and shaped the US programs. To be in any level of the Judge Training program requires a great deal of dedication and time commitment. The programs are very much worth the effort as you gain an amazing education that applies to training, teaching and riding as well.

Now you know what all the Letters mean!

A Ride with Thorsten

On June 30th, I participated in a clinic taught by Thorsten Kramer, at Sarkozi Training Center. Thorsten rode Yze in the beginning of our lesson. He quickly identified an issue I have had with Yze, that is consistently making Yze move off the leg immediately and smartly. Thorsten worked with Yze in all gaits, focussing on this issue. He reinforced his light leg aids with the whip. When I was mounted, Thorsten encouraged me to be relaxed in the saddle and keep my legs off Yze until I required something of him, then using the whip to make Yze more alert and responsive to my leg. We then worked on forwardness with hind-end engagement, and self-carriage, which can be a challenge with a Friesian!! With a lot of outside rein half-halts, and the driving force of Thorsten from behind, we got a lovely forward, collected energetic canter from my sprawly boy. I thoroughly enjoyed Thorsten’s knowledge and energy. It was very hot and muggy and I’m not sure who worked harder, me, Yze or Thorsten.

- Dressage Sport Horse Breeding Stock (In-Hand) Classes**
Updated USDF Rules
- Horses of one sex may not be judged against those of the opposite sex except in specified Group classes. Champion classes or special classes for single breeds or ancestry/youngster rider handlers.
 - A horse shall be disqualified for unsoundness (at the judge's discretion in Breeding Stock and Group classes). In Dressage Sport Horse Breeding classes, unsoundness is defined as showing evidence of lameness or broken wind. Refer to DR119-1 regarding loss of sight.
 - Following a posted or announced order, an entry will walk to the apex of the triangle, and await the judge's request to proceed on the triangle. The handler will lead the horse on the perimeter of the triangle at walk and trot, returning to the apex to stand for conformation judging. Conformation is judged before and/or after movement. Repetition of all or any part of the movement on the triangle is allowed only at the judge's request.
 - After all horses have been shown on the triangle, score or all may be recalled to be shown in groups at a walk and trot. If horses may be recalled, the prize list or program must state that this procedure will be used.
 - When two or more judges are officiating, they may agree to use the same score sheets and agree on each score before informing the scorer, or they may judge independently. Class cards score are not permitted for individual in-hand classes.
 - The judge(s) must excuse from the ring any unruly horse or one whose actions threaten to endanger handlers, officials, other exhibitors or their entries.
 - Scores must be reported as a total based on the percentages allowed in each judging category, against a possible total of 100%, and all scores and placings must be published. Unofficial scores may be published during the class and/or final scores may be published at the end of each class. Decimals may be used in scoring.
 - Tied scores shall be broken first by referring to movement scores. If tied, the tie may be broken at the judge's discretion, by the use of decimals, or the horses may be examined again (movement only). If a class is judged by more than one judge, the judge may consult and arrive at one agreed upon placement. (The USDF's Final classes will remain tied.)
 - Dressing is optional. Bandages of any kind are forbidden during a class.
 - Brides are mandatory on two-year olds and older. Brides are forbidden on bays and weanlings. A bridle shall consist of a snaffle type bit (see DR121, Figure 1A) with two reins and headed with throatlatch. Reins must be attached only to bits as described in DR121.6. Headstall is optional. A split or single chain may be used instead of or in addition to reins, however a lead shank is required if reins are placed over the horse's neck and the handler must hold the shank.
 - The handler, assistant handler and/or a who assistant may each carry only one whip, or one standard lanyard whip (without attachments, i.e. plastic tags, etc.). In addition, discipline restraining devices are not permitted in the competition ring.
 - Conservative sports attire is recommended for handlers, assistant handlers and who assistants. Handlers, assistant handlers and who assistants of any age must wear protective headgear as defined by DR208 while handling or assisting in the competition ring.
 - Each horse, including non-competing mares accompanying bays, must have a separate handler or assistant handler at all times.
 - The competition veterinarian must be available to the judge, if on the premises, and the handler must give permission to the judge and/or veterinarian before touching the horse. If the veterinarian is not immediately available, or not called upon, the judge's decision as to the serviceable soundness of a horse must be final.
 - Assistant handlers may not show a horse at the trot (except for horses not being judged but accompanying a mare or foal that is being judged).
 - No horse that is not being judged may accompany another horse in the ring while being judged, except for a mare accompanying a foal or vice versa.
 - Unauthorized assistance by individuals outside the competition ring is not permitted.
