Volunteers needed for CBLM in Lexington – get your 8 hours volunteer credit towards VADA year end. Minutes sent for the newsletter

**Schooling shows:** Pinky has put forth a tentative schedule for schooling show for 2020 in conjunction with other large licensed shows.

I would like to add a November show if we could get an indoor. This is just a working list. If you see any problems please speak up.

**Championship Schooling show:** We will be having a pizza party on Saturday afternoon before our championship show and a costume class during the lunch break on Sunday. Beth is working on getting the contract with the Wakefield facility. Marie is running an svda sanctioned show on Sat and will leave her ring up for us to use on Sunday.

SCHOLARSHIPS Karen Barnard compete, Debbie Bowden \$250 requested a 6 month extension Dahlia Jensen Balance \$180 – requested a 6 month extension, Joanne Smith Balance \$100 requested a 6 month extension

Sandy motioned to approve all requested extensions. – Whitney 2<sup>nd</sup> –Approved by All

AWARDS and BANQUET: Carol will do the Candid Slide show this year. Pictures should be sent to Carol – Cookie will advertise on FB.

Hodges order is in and trying to get in touch with Hilton about menu. May look into different venues next year because of multiple changes in Hilton mgmt. and difficulties with communication but reasonable pricing is important. The rest of awards report will be done after banquet. Carol to set up membership table separately. No theme. Jessica Stallings is helping with auction again this year.

CLINICS and PROGRAMS – Proposed fix a test could be anytime of the show season.

Currently have 20 rides scheduled for Donna Gatchell clinic on January 11 and 12 at Happy Valley, Suffolk, VA. Subject to change as entries are not closed as of yet. Missing entries from several folks who expressed interest. Hope to update at meeting on Sunday.

Rate is \$110 for Donna Gatchell per lesson plus mileage, \$10 haul-in to Happy Valley, insurance to cover property and rider, \$5.00 per ride. SVDA contribution is \$20 toward each ride and coverage of insurance costs. So total cost to members is \$105

Proposed General Membership meeting date Sunday, November 1. Will shoot to have a fall clinic separate from the meeting will shoot for the fall clinic the same weekend as the already scheduled membership meeting in order to take advantage of the regularly scheduled clinician.

The board agreed that a Fix A Test is useful any time of year and the fix a test doesn't have to coincide with the Championship Schooling Show. Other planned clinics would include a spring clinic in March/April.

Two Low Cost Clinics spring and fall and a Fall Clinic October/November based on date availability.

Investigating summer clinic to include clinicians, workshops for horses and riders, personal coaching and development possibly at Wakefield. Essentially mini-summer camp for members.

At a show – some people may not be able to attend due to competing and we have new members hat join throughout the year

TREASURER – Evelyn has done some recent extensive calculations and gave a report for income/expenses for a 5 year period: On 1/1/19: \$21,320 2019 total income of \$25,121, Expenses \$29,527 Balance \$16,965.00 but that includes expenses for this years banquet/awards without the corresponding income at this time. 5 year income AVERAGE \$24,000 and Expenses of \$26,000 .


















#### **PRIX CAPRILLI TESTS**

A Prix Caprilli, named after the great Italian rider who was the father of the modern forward seat for jumping, is a dressage test with jumps included.

The tests have the same movements as a preliminary/novice dressage test and include the requirement for horse and rider to trot and/or canter over single jumps.

The judges will judge this test the same as a normal dressage test that includes technical marks for the movement, impulsion, submission and riding.

The emphasis is not the jumping style of the horse, it is on the horse's relaxation, obedience and evenness of pace.

It is a dressage test that happens to have jumps in the way and the jumps should not disrupt the standard performance expected in a dressage test.

It is worth thinking about the riding style you will adopt over the jumps as you will need to establish a position over the jumps that assists the horse in freely jumping over the jump without any resistance.

Practice at home in your own dressage arena before the day. It's something different to the normal dressage test and a bit of fun. Why not have a go!

This test is an encouragement test and there for the trotting / canter stage is optional to the rider but you will get scored higher in the canter than trot for giving it a go.

Let the judge know what option you take before the test so they can mark you correctly.


