FREE ZOOM EDUCATIONAL MEETINGS – open to all – with special invitations to SVDA members and friends of SVDA on FB ..aka Horse girl learns to run ZOOM!

I wanted to do something for the horse community during the Covid-19 Quarantine when we all felt so isolated from each other and off our normal schedules. I saw a few of my colleagues were doing ZOOM educational meetings. I had purchased a subscription to ZOOM because I have been teaching quite a few virtual lessons both locally and around the country. So I thought its worth a try to do locally...

The first one in early April I did myself – the topic was “Rider Position and Effect”. I felt like it was my own dog and pony show – I showed how I use my elastic bands, I got up and down and onto the floor to show different Pilates based exercises that can mimic the feel you need in the saddle. But It was FUN! It challenged me to put it all together to present in the conference in 45 minutes. Just what we all need during the quarantine, is something to challenge ourselves!

2 Weeks later my good friend, fellow “S” judge and “L” faculty colleague, Joan Darnell, gave an excellent discussion on Musical Freestyles. She covered soup to nuts very succulently but thoroughly for us and we ended by watching an inspiring 3rd LL freestyle that her daughter Claire performed on her amazing Harold S! Joan and I spend some time on Zoom learning how to share the Power point slides and the U tube Video. So I thought I was getting pretty at it. But I was wrong!

On the first Weds in June, Dr. Cathy Lombardi, DVM from Oaks Equine joined us to give an outstanding discussion on Vaccines and on Biosecurity. SVDA Board meeting Monday April 6th, 2020, via teleconference

Board members present: Kathy, Cookie, Beth, Pinky, Charlene, Wendy, Sandy, Toni, Joann, Sarah, Ray, Janice, Melisa, Laura C, Robyn, Lora G, Evelyn, Whitney,

Minutes from previous teleconference approved. Sarah motioned to approve, Beth 2nd, all approved.

VP Report : Not recruiting volunteers at this time. VADA: nothing new, as of today the clinic and DAL are still on track.

Treasurer's Report: The Current checking account balance is \$19,403.19. There are 2 checks that have not cleared the bank yet so the bank shows \$19,575.19. Attached is a printout with online activity and the March bank statement. Activity since the last meeting (not included are checks that were included in last report but didn't clear the bank until this period): Income \$784.48: \$320.00 memberships, \$164.48 from awards sponsors and \$300 sanctioned show fees Expenses \$714.69: \$260.00 in scholarships, \$246 USDF, \$72 VADA, \$249.95 Formsite, \$45 constant contact and \$91.69 Tribute Store.

About 2 weeks ago we received a \$35 donation check from Network for Good. It appears someone made a donation to SVDA from Facebook. I attached a copy of that along with the 12 page terms & conditions that we must adhere to if we cash the check. I need to get approval to deposit this into the bank. Board consensus is that this is suspicious and should be shredded.

Awards : Nothing to report from awards. I have left a message with the manager at the Hilton to try to get January 23rd for a banquet date because VADA is booked for January 30th (Cookie).

Clinics and Programs: Low Cost Clinics for us for April and May are now on hold as are our other events.

Planning for our General Membership Meeting in October. Melissa Jamison recommended Lehua Custer from Florida.

We would like to schedule a 2 1/2 day clinic on Friday, Saturday and 1/2 day on Sunday, October 2-4. She is available for demonstration or speaking at our General Membership Meeting on the 4th.

Her lesson rate is \$150. Lessons can be shared if needed. She prefers one on one with riders, but will agree this request. Her speaking fee is an additional \$200. Melissa Jamison is offering to pay for her airfare and have her stay with her. But depending on the clinic location arrange lodging as well as food-beverages as usual.

I feel we would also be able to apply for VADA grant to assist with payment of this clinic. May also be an opportunity for CE hours.

Looking for feedback on this clinic. Would suggest we contribute \$30 per rider to make it affordable for our members, insurance for clinic and porta john. Location to be determined upon Board approval. Beth motioned to approve, Charlene 2nd, board approved.

12: Juniors: Held Meeting February 28th

Potentially 16 riders, 3 western dressage, 1 lead-line and multiple traditional dressage (intro-1st level)

- We have raised about ~\$2000 for juniors through the silent auction (2020) and concessions (2019 deposited in 2020). These funds are not enough to pay for all riders to attend the championship show as well as pay for the coach's hotel expenses and the golf cart rentals. Based on the possible number of riders with an estimated \$350 per rider for costs, we will need to raise about \$4800 for all 16. Expenses included in the \$350 are entry fees, coaches' hotels, golf cart rental, stabling fees and team shirts/saddle pads. Cost of decorations, meals and travel are the responsibility of the rider and their family.
- Fundraising ideas were Hosting a Sanctioned Show to benefit Juniors (Ingrid), Concessions at SVDA shows (Charlene and Katie), Panera Bread Nights (Charlene), Raffle/baskets at championship show (everyone), lock-in at a barn with games (Ingrid, Layla and others) and Paint Nights (Charlene and Ingrid). Would like to have one paint night in Suffolk and one paint night in Va Beach. Horse Show at Ingrid's Barn and Lock-in at Ingrid's or Melanie's. Also discussed adding back the live auction at the banquet if we can get a good donation for a live auction. Layla's grandfather volunteered to organize concessions and purchase supplies since he has significant experience with concessions mgmt. We still need volunteers to man the concession stands for the upcoming SVDA shows for concessions: March 22 – Epps, April 19 – Wes Neck in Va Beach, May 17 – River Birch in Courtland, and Jun 7 – Peace Haven Farm in Smithfield. Charlene, Dahlia, Katie and Ava will help at Epps. Layla and Her grandfather or riders at Ingrid's barns could do West Neck. We can decide the other at the next meeting.
- Voted on team theme and "Disney" theme won. This is a good general theme and then each team of 3-4 can select a Disney movie to be their specific theme and create decorations. Teams could work on decorations at the Lock-in.
- Discussed team shirts and saddle pads – decided that since there are Western Dressage riders, a saddle pad would not work because of the cost of the western pads and difficulty embroidering thicker western pads. Looking at team shirt colors to be red, mint/light green or light blue. Charlene will contact Kelly Skelton about shirts and bring options to the next meeting.
- Discussed options for coaches – Ingrid volunteered, and she also volunteered Melanie (Mel was last year's coach). We will still need at least one more coach based on the number for riders attending. SVDA will pay for the coaches' hotel rooms and golf cart rental.

Next meeting April 17th, Charlene will email out a Zoom meeting invite and we will complete the meeting virtually.

- At the next meeting: We will confirm dates of paint nights, lock-in and horse show. We will decide more about other fundraisers such as concessions and raffles. We will complete the entry forms, create teams and finalize count of riders. We will decide on shirt color and get sizes for all riders.
- Questions about braiding for Western Dressage – multiple people can help braid, but Charlene will ask Janice or Robin about rules for braiding with western dressage.
- Question about clothing – show packet said schooling show attire so, we will not need jackets or white pants for traditional dressage, jeans or western show pants should be fine for western dressage.
- Entries will be mailed in but, no money until show is confirmed to be happening.

Fundraising limited since, first few shows of the season are cancelled.

Meeting minutes were emailed out to Junior team participants, uploaded to the SVDA page and posted to FACEBOOK.

To complete the template, the SVDA schooling show entry form must be updated to include: Rider USDF Number, Owner USDF Number, Horse USDF Number, Horse Breed, Horse Year of Birth. Updated Prize list must be submitted when we make the application. Toni will update the forms and send it to the subcommittee for review. *VADA/NOVA schooling show entry form used for reference*

The SVDA Schooling Show Prize List must also be submitted, so we should update our prize list for awards program shows to include show specific information such as: Show date, Location, open/close dates, Judge. *VADA/NOVA March schooling prize list used for reference*

VADA MINUTES – CONFERENCE CALL MEETING 06-10-2020

Anne Draine made the motion to accept the minutes from the last meeting. Dianne Nathan seconded, and the Board approved unanimously.

Treasurer's Report - Jessie reported very little activity. Main activity is from sponsorships. Balances are 112K.

DAL: Is happening!! VHC has posted their COVID requirements on line so please review. VHC will take care of temperatures checks for people coming on the property as well as a health screen. They will be using a wrist band system to identify people who have been checked. Hand washing and sanitizing stations are located throughout the property. They will be doing additional cleaning. Food service is still undecided, but they will provide food trucks more than likely. We'll be using Alison Campbell as usual but with bag lunches with a pre order requirement. There will be major changes for show office setup. Volunteer check in will be on the mezzanine and awards will be upstairs as well. We will have inside and outside vendors with a number of new types of vendors. Will be using the four rings on the downside of the property to keep things a bit more contained. Warm up should not be an issue. We have to have additional written procedures. There will also be changes to our refund policy related to COVID. We are also only accepting COMPLETE online entries to minimize interaction with people and paper. We are investigating how we have judges and scribes interact. We are allowed to use cell phones which is a change. Tina is going to make sanitizer for us. There will be no awards ceremonies and we'll work with sponsors for photo opps. The program will only be online. Music for freestyles will also have to be uploaded- we will not accept CD. Competitors should bring appropriate PPE such as work gloves, paper towels for the bathrooms, etc. Stabling will be done by barn groups with an empty/tack stall between groups. VHC has a mask on policy unless you're riding. VHC is limiting the amount of people that will be allowed per horse. We will be giving out masks (one size- Adult only) instead of T-Shirts. Volunteers will NOT be sharing hotel rooms unless you're comfortable doing that and tell Rachel who you are willing to share a hotel room with. For stewards, there is no contact with the horse., equipment checks are visual. If there is anything questionable, you call the TD. There will be no competitor party.

GAIGS: October 8-11 Region 1 voted to have VADA host the GAIGS for 2021 which was approved by the USDF.

Webinars: The South Florida Dressage Association is hosting a virtual USDF GMO Book Club Meeting with Janet Foy on June 24th. It is free and they have invited all GMO members to participate. If interested sign up on https://www.striderpro.com/a/ZCj-C2Rjkb-UHCqzv0cu_Q.

Bill Warren Clinic- Gardy is still going forward with her clinic and is looking to get it videotaped. VADA is going to do a clinic next year and all the grants will carryover.

USDF Region 1 Youth Virtual Team Competition June 27-28th- There is an entry fee but there will be awards. Information is on the Region 1 dedicated to the youth team website with suggestions on how best to videotape. Anne Draine reported that NEVADA has done a couple of virtual shows and they have the virtual scoresheet already so contact her if you'd like it.

Chapter Challenge: Nancy Doody did the survey which was sent out with the agenda. We thank her for doing a phenomenal job with the summary. Based on the comments, Tina feels that since this also a new facility and it's supposed to be a team competition, that we don't move forward. Sheli commented that there is a big difference

between where people will go for a licensed show vs a schooling show and the chapters in the area did not really respond to the survey. We would like to use this facility for next year. The motion was made by Sherri Booye and seconded by Laura Nelson to cancel this year and have it next year. The motion passed unanimously. The committee will propose a date for next year.

New Business- Chapter grants will be available as usual. And there has always been a policy that chapters can rollover years so if you're not doing one this year, you can combine for next year.

The meeting adjourned at approximately 8:54 pm

Next meeting will be held via teleconference on July 22nd at 8 pm.

USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program

SVDA is pleased to participate in the 2020 USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program for 3 shows:

July 5 (Pleasant Ridge, Virginia Beach)
July 19 (Amazing Grace, Carrollton)
October 18 (TBD)

General Information:

1. Program year is December 1 through November 30.
2. Scores may be earned in any USDF region.
3. Late nominations, applications and results submissions will not be accepted.

Rider Eligibility & Requirements:

1. Rider must have a USDF Group Membership that is recorded by the Group Member Organization (GMO) at the time the scores are earned.
2. Riders affiliated with an International GMO must declare a USDF region.
3. Owner must have at least a USDF non-member number at the time the scores are earned.
4. Horse must have at least a USDF Horse Identification Number at the time the scores are earned.
5. Rider must submit a one-time yearly online nomination and \$35 nomination fee for each horse/rider combination no later than 14 days after the last day of the first competition. The nomination fee must be paid annually.
6. Riders may change their division status during the program year. A rider's status will be determined at the end of the program year.
7. Rider must submit scores to USDF online no later than 21 days after the last day of the competition.
8. Only USDF members in good standing are eligible to compete in the USDF Regional Schooling Show Awards Program and receive awards.

Award Divisions & Levels:

1. Four award divisions will be recognized per region:
 - a. Open: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22, not a USEF Adult Amateur (AA), not a non-professional.
 - b. Junior/Young Rider (Jr/YR): up until the end of the calendar year the rider reaches age 21.
 - c. AA: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22 and possess a current USEF AA card.
 - d. Non-Professional: from the beginning of the calendar year the rider reaches age 22, not a current USEF AA, not a professional.
2. Seven levels (freestyle, pas de deux and quadrille not included) will be recognized per division. Exception: only 6 levels are recognized in the open division:
 - a. Introductory (only in Jr/YR, AA and non-professional divisions)
 - b. Training
 - c. First
 - d. Second
 - e. Third
 - f. Fourth
 - g. FEI – combination of Prix St. Georges, Intermediate I, Intermediate II and Grand Prix scores.
3. Equivalencies listed in the current *USDF Member Guide* are eligible. Tests not listed as equivalencies will not be eligible.

4. Preliminary standings will be ranked using a median of all eligible scores and will be available on the USDF website.
5. Final awards standings will be based on the rider's region of primary residence in the USDF database as of November 30.

Score requirements:

1. Introductory Level:
 - a. Must have a minimum of five scores
 - b. From three different judges
 - c. From three different competitions
2. Training through Fourth Levels (levels may not be combined to meet requirements):
 - a. Must have a minimum of five scores
 - b. From three different judges
 - c. From three different competitions
 - d. At least one score must be earned from the highest test of the level
3. FEI Level (levels may be combined to meet requirements):
 - a. Must have a minimum of four scores
 - b. From three different judges
 - c. From three different competitions

Arena Notes

Small arenas are 20x40 meters; standard arenas are 20x60 meters. Regulation sizing is preferred, but we allow some flexibility. Get as close to these measurements as you can, given whatever space constraints you have. Please be sure to set up corners (poles work well) and mark the letters appropriately—improvising with buckets, cones, etc. is perfectly acceptable. 😊

Rules for Videoing Your Test

- **Position camera in line with C** but far enough away to see entire horse as it passes C.
- Videos must be continuous from start to end of test; no combining of clips is allowed.
- Readers are allowed. **Coaching is not allowed.** Background audio must be included.
- **Videos must be filmed horizontally (landscape mode)** to maximize the judge's view of the arena.
- Keep rider and horse in frame. Pan left or right to follow the rider into the near corners.
- **Zoom in when rider is past X so that movements are still clearly visible.**
- Stay zoomed out enough (entire ride) so that the judge can assess geometry, accuracy.
