Carter has competed through Grand Prix winning Regional Championships and earning USDF Bonze, Silver and Gold medals on a homebred Oldenburg.

Having trained extensively with Olympian Sue Blinks and Grand Prix rider and trainer Pati Pierucci, as well as training her own horse Coronado from green broke through Prix St. Georges, Elise offers a deep breadth of dressage knowledge which she is passionate about sharing with her students. An enthusiastic instructor, Elise's fundamental goals are to help her students gain a better understanding of dressage and achieve clearer communication with their horses.

Scholarship Report on Becca Vick Clinic by Debbie Bowden

I was very pleased and excited to take advantage of scholarship funds at my first SVDA clinic at Mike and Kathy Rowse's beautiful Silverleaf Farm with Rebecca Vick. While I was a little nervous to be riding my cow-bred AQHA Promise to Cut, aka Jesse, under a Grand Prix Dressage Rider and USDF Bronze, Silver, and Gold Medalist, Becca immediately put me at ease by asking me to tell her about myself and my horse.

First of all I have Multiple Sclerosis. Not an excuse, just a reason for certain challenges. (The first is you can't pass a bathroom without stopping, although some of that comes with being 64.) Secondly, although Becca used a headset, which comes in handy when you have a squeaky Western saddle, it can take a little time for something you just said directly into my ear to work its way down to my inside leg and outside rein. Third, I will never be able to memorize a Dressage test past tracking left or right at C, so if you tell me something that has several elements you may have to repeat them.

With a competition background in Arabian Saddle Seat and Sidesaddle, I never pictured myself as a Western rider or competing in Dressage, but when the right horse comes into your life you adapt to their strengths. Jesse and I ended up at Briar Glen Riding Academy at a time when owner/trainer Pamela McGeough needed a competition horse, and he was the chosen one. After watching her ride Western Dressage on him for two seasons, I decided I needed to do it, too. I rode my first tests on my 60th birthday, and came away 1st in both tests. There's more to life than 20-meter circles, though, and we also enjoy weekend cattle drives and trail riding with friends. We're working our way towards longer, steeper, and more challenging rides, but I haven't told Jesse yet.

While Jesse and I warmed up we discussed the elements of the Level 1 WDAA tests that I'm currently riding, and what I felt like we needed the most help with. Besides geometry, my weaknesses have been in my leg yields and turns on the forehand. We started with jogging 10-, 15-, and 20-meter circles and half circles. Thanks to the hours I've spent at the gym this year I have "leg" for the first time in my life, and Becca actually expressed a little surprise when my little Quarter Horse moved into 4-wheel-drive.

We proceeded to lope work, where I have a tendency to "perch", so we worked on keeping my seat in the back of the saddle and sitting up straighter by opening my hip angle. I also have a problem with letting my reins get longer, so there was a lot of emphasis on shortening my reins while keeping my shoulders back and my hands low and bringing them back towards my hips. We then did some work on center line and achieving straightness before starting our leg yields. After working on some turns on the forehand we ended with extended lope circles in both directions.

It was a very productive clinic, and I came away with some lots of things to work on.

Chinese Herbals in Horses by Lyndy Soboleski

Chinese Herbs and herbal formulas have been used as early as four thousand years ago. To understand herbal medicine, one needs to know which herbs or herbal formulas have certain actions and will in turn give a certain result in the animal. Chinese herbals are categorized by the herbal's temperature, taste, direction of energy, and channels entered.¹

There are several different ways to administer different herbals. The most common method is orally, dosed in capsules, granules, teapills, and powder. Concentrated granules are the most prefered method in equine herbal therapies. Some herbals can be given externally. These formulations come in salves for soreness, swelling, and treating wounds. Herbal tinctures are also used for treating swelling and pain. Eye and ear drops are also available to be applied directly to these areas.

Various equine conditions can benefit from Chinese Herbal Medicine. The most common equine condition for herbal use is to treat musculoskeletal conditions. For example, *Equine Du Huo* aids in back pain, joint pain, and chronic injury. The Chinese Principle of Treatment for *Equine Du Huo* is to tonify Kidney Yang and strengthen bones, clear Wind-Cold-Damp, invigorate Qi and Blood, and relieve pain.² This herbal formula is indicated in horses showing a weak, deep pulse and pale or pale purple Tongue.

Another herbal formula used in horses is Body Sore or *Shen Tong Zhu Yu Tang*. Body Sore is used for treating generalized back soreness, joint and muscle pain. The Chinese principle of treatment for Body Sore is to invigorate Qi - Blood and relieve pain. The TCVM or Traditional Chinese Veterinary Medicine indications for Body Sore are Qi Stagnation and or Blood Stagnation and Channel Blockages.³ Horses which benefit from Body Sore have a fast Pulse and purple Tongue.

Qi performance is a great herbal formulation for athletes such as dressage horses in that it helps to decrease physiological fatigue, psychogenic stress, and pain.² The indications for this herbal formulation are poor performance, Qi Deficiency with Qi Stagnation, exercise intolerance, muscle pain, weight loss, pale and wet Tongue and deep and weak Pulse. The Chinese principle of treatment of Qi performance is to tonify Qi and Blood, move Blood, and relieve pain.

Tendon and Ligament formula is used widely in competition horses to treat horses with weakness or poor growth of tendon and ligament, chronic tendonitis, and acute tendon damage.² External treatment is also recommended using Relief salve applied to the tendon topically. Relief Salve is applied to the injured tendon then bandaged 12 hours on - 12 hours off for up to 3 months. The TCVM indications for tendon ligament formula are Liver Yin with Blood deficiency, dry eyes, pain in tendons, poor growth or weakness of tendon, cracked hooves, thready and weak Pulse and tongue that's dry without coating.²

Another commonly used herbal formulation is Hindquarter Weakness. This herbal formulation is used in horses with hindquarter weakness, sore and weak back. TCVM indications for this herbal are Kidney Qi + Yin Deficiency, dry skin, rear weakness, deep weak and thready pulse and dry red Tongue.

These are just a few examples of herbals in competition horses. There are many others for other indications such as Gastrointestinal conditions, Cushing's, anhidrosis, laminitis, corneal ulceration, GI ulceration, skin problems, wound healing, and cancer.

The most important aspect to remember is herbal medicine must use the information from a Western physical examination as well as a TCVM examination which looks at Tongue, Pulse, temperature of the animal, the constitution in a five element aspect, and diagnostic palpation of acupuncture points and trigger points.

VADA MINUTES – CONFERENCE CALL MEETING 8/28/2019

The meeting began at 8pm.

Present on the call were: Bettina Longaker, Sheli King, Jessie Ginsbburg, Sherri Boye, barb Ellis, Angela Stanaway, Nancy Doody, Nancy Lowey, Dianne Boyd, Rachel Rice, Sandy Tobey, Anne Draine, Meredith McGrath, Laura Nelson, Jane Palmer and Susan Ellis

Laura moved that we approve the minutes of the last meeting, Anne seconded and the Board approved unanimously. **Treasure's Report:** Jessie gave a report but explained that the actual account balance was not yet settled as there were some checks from DAL that had not yet cleared. She also noted that she was starting to see both expenses and income coming in for the Fall show.

Chapter Challenge: Meredith gave a wrap-up of the show which was hosted by Nova at Morven Park on August 3rd. While the show went well, it was clear that the committee needs to meet and consider adopting additional rules for the show and also make tweaks to the special awards. These awards need to be objective and not subjective (like best turned out or most bling) and we need to make sure we capture all information needed to award the prize on the entry form (such as horse's height to determine pony eligibility.) We also need to discuss whether special awards should be limited to VADA members and the policy on combining classes based on entry size. The committee will meet and develop recommendations for the Board to approve. Based on the existing rotation, the show next year is scheduled to be in Lexington, hosted by the nearby chapters (SWVADA, Shenvada and VADA CH.)

Dressage at Lexington: Tina gave a wrap-up and said that the show went really well and definitely made a reasonable profit but the exact amount is still to be determined as certain categories of expenses and income still need to be tallied. The SHAC structure that we adopted this year was clearly a success and as a result, there was very good participation in the awards ceremonies.

BLMs: Entries are starting to come in and Tina will work with our web coordinator to make sure that all links to the show website are operational. Dianne reported that the competitors party will be Friday night, with Saturday night devoted to the doggie costume class (sponsored by Kem Barbosa, Cletus King and VTO Saddlery), musical freestyles and the vendor's dessert party. While we won't have a stall decorating contest this year, Nancy Doody has generously agreed to sponsor the decorations in the courtyard. We already have 9 vendors and Dianne will be ordering some replacement parts for our rings, in the amount of about \$500, the make sure they remain in good repair.

Chapter Activities:

A problem was noted with getting payment for a chapter grant and Tina said she would check with Beth on this. Chapters were reminded that once they receive a grant, they need to submit an article about the activity it was used to subsidize. Tina will ensure that there is a place for these articles on our website.

Fredericksburg: Their licensed shows on 9/7 & 8 are large. They are also hosting a clinic with Christoph Hess on October 16 & 17th in Spotsylvania; information will be available on their web site in the near future.

NEVADA: They hosted a schooling show on 8/31 that was well subscribed and they are holding another at the State Fair at the Meadows Event Park on October 3rd.

NOVA: Their Schooling Show Championship and Open Show will be on November 2nd at Morven Park

SHENVADA: Their last schooling show of the year will be September 7th at Cedar Creek (Melanie Worth's)

SWVADA: They are co-hosting a dressage show/combined test with Blue Ridge Eventing Association on October 20 and a cavaletti clinic with Tracey Smith-Oliver on October 20 at Green Hill Park

Southeast: They are holding a schooling show on September 22 at Bridlewood Farm, a FAT on September 28 and their schooling show championship on October 27. They are also hosting a young horse in hand clinic on October 19th with Carter Bass followed by a riding clinic, also with Carter on the 20th.

VADA Clinic: Tina raised the possibility of VADA partnering with Gardy Bloemers to host a clinic at her new facility in 2020, possibly with George Williams or Bill Warren. It was recommended that the VADA Clinics committee be revived and they work on a clinic proposal to present to the Board.

USDF Convention: Will be held in Savannah on December 5-8. Based on its membership, VADA is entitled to 2 GMO Representative, and in accordance with its policies of first selecting officers and then chapter representatives, Tina designates Sheli & Jessie to represent VADA.

The next meeting will be on September 18th at 8pm, via conference call.

We will be setting up tables and chairs by awards and having ice cream as this was received well at DAL. Because we don't foresee night classes, we discussed moving the competitor party to Saturday after classes end and do the dog show at the same time.

USDF Convention: Will be held in Savannah on December 5-8. Sheli will be doing a featured education presentation on suitable attire entitled "Traditional, Trendy or Too Far" with Gwen Ka'awaloa and Donna Meyer. Chapters who wish to donate items for the GMO Gift Basket may bring them to the fall show or contact Sheli for the best way to get them to her. Sheli and Jessie are the VADA delegates.

Shel Gafford Award: Chapters please start thinking about nominations. Sheli will be sending a flyer.

Annual Awards Banquet: Flyer and form to come out soon and will be in the BLM program. The banquet will be held on Sunday, February 9th at the Greencroft Club which is just down the road from the Boar's Head in Charlottesville.

Chapter Activities:

Fredericksburg: They are also hosting a clinic with Christoph Hess on October 16 & 17th in Spotsylvania; information will be available on their web site in the near future.

NEVADA: They are holding a schooling show on Sept 29th, and another at the State Fair at the Meadows Event Park on October 3rd.

NOVA: Their Schooling Show Championship and Open Show will be on November 2nd at Morven Park

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Southeast: They are holding a schooling show on September 22 at Bridlewood Farm, a FAT on September 28 and their schooling show championship on October 27. 
